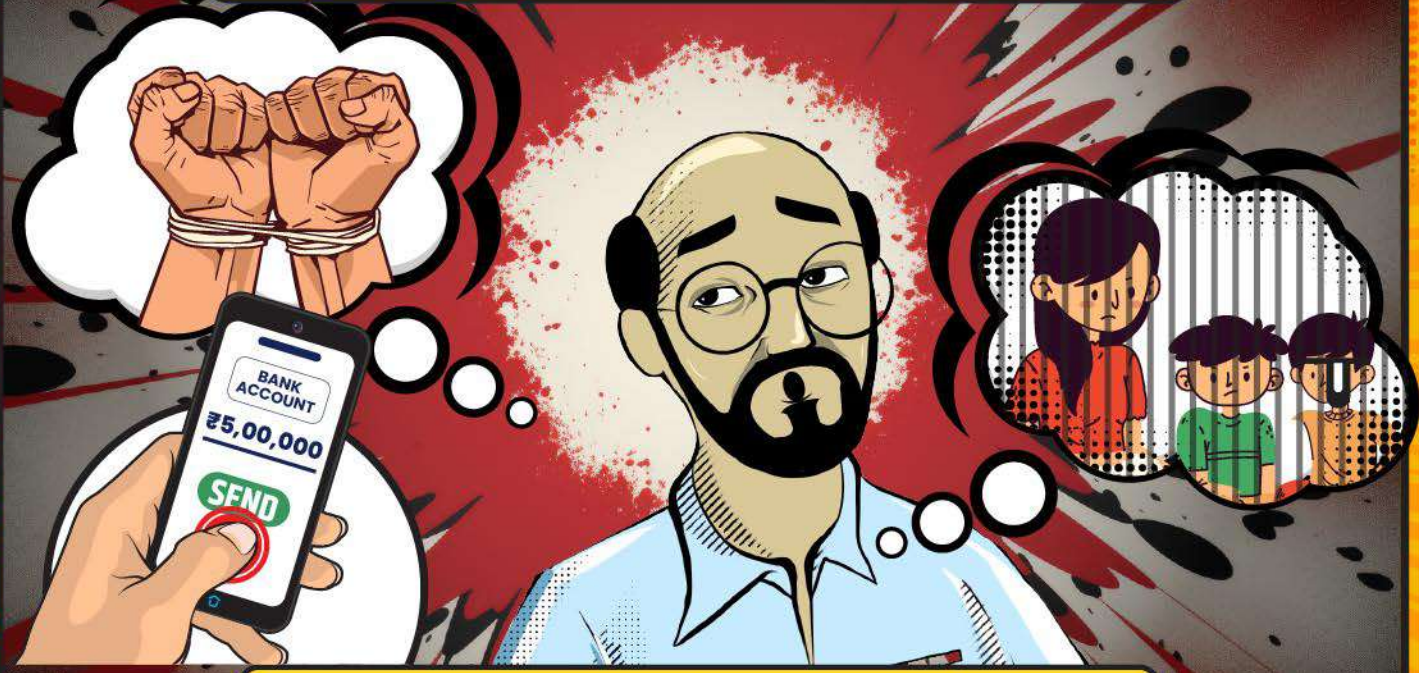


Mr. Bhola and the Digital Arrest Trap

Mr. Bhola is working on his laptop at home. Suddenly, he gets a video call.



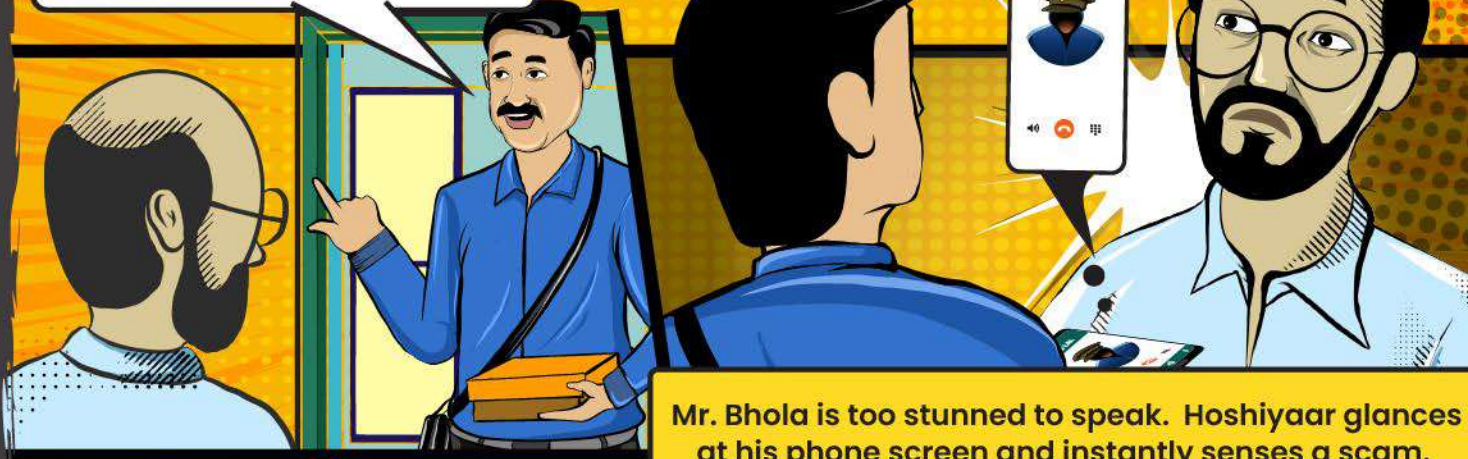
Bhola ji, scared by the thought of getting arrested and bringing shame to his family, gets ready to pay the money.

These scammers create fake police stations and arrest warrants, preying on fear. They leverage on the fear and emotional pressure to trap people into sending money online.

Just then, Hoshiyaar Singh enters the cabin with a bunch of files.

MONEY MONEY

Sir, here are some documents that need your sign...

He pauses, noticing Mr. Venkat's excitement.

Today's my lucky day! At this rate, I'll become a Slumdog Millionaire in no time!

Oh wow, sir! What's the lottery? Do tell me too!

Hoshiyaar Singh, you came at the perfect time! Look at this- someone added me to a investment group. These tips are amazing!

He shows him the group and the messages.

Apologies, sir... but this group and the messages look fake to me. It's most likely the work of a scammer.

What?! A scam? With me??

Small investment, huge returns! Invest ₹5,000 in Bitcoin today and earn ₹50,000 in just one week! Join us now!

SCAM!

Yes, sir. No kind of investment can make you rich overnight. In fact, these people can empty your bank account! You should report this number immediately on the 'Check and Report' tab at www.cybercrime.gov.in.

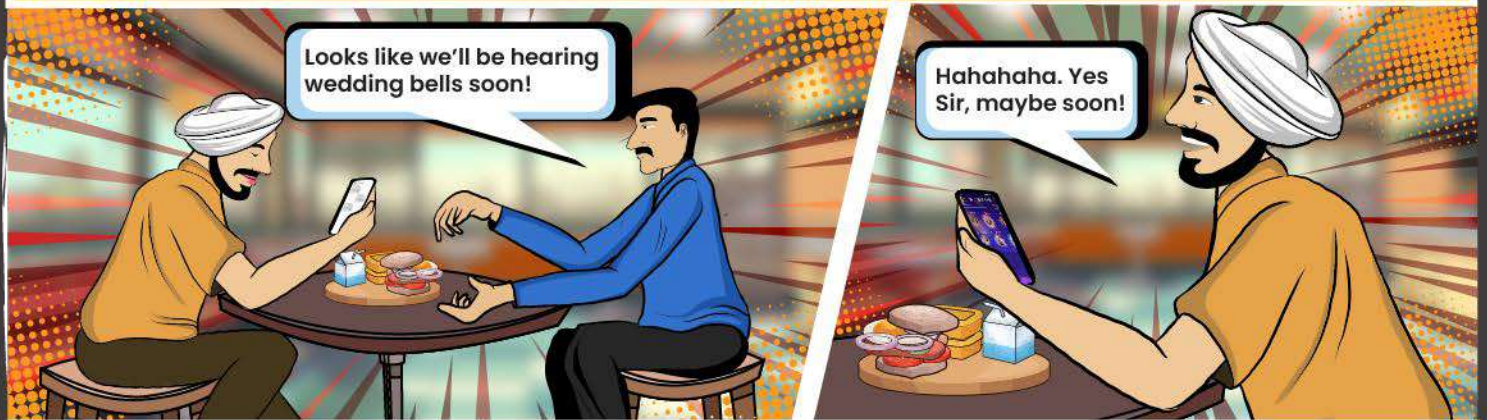

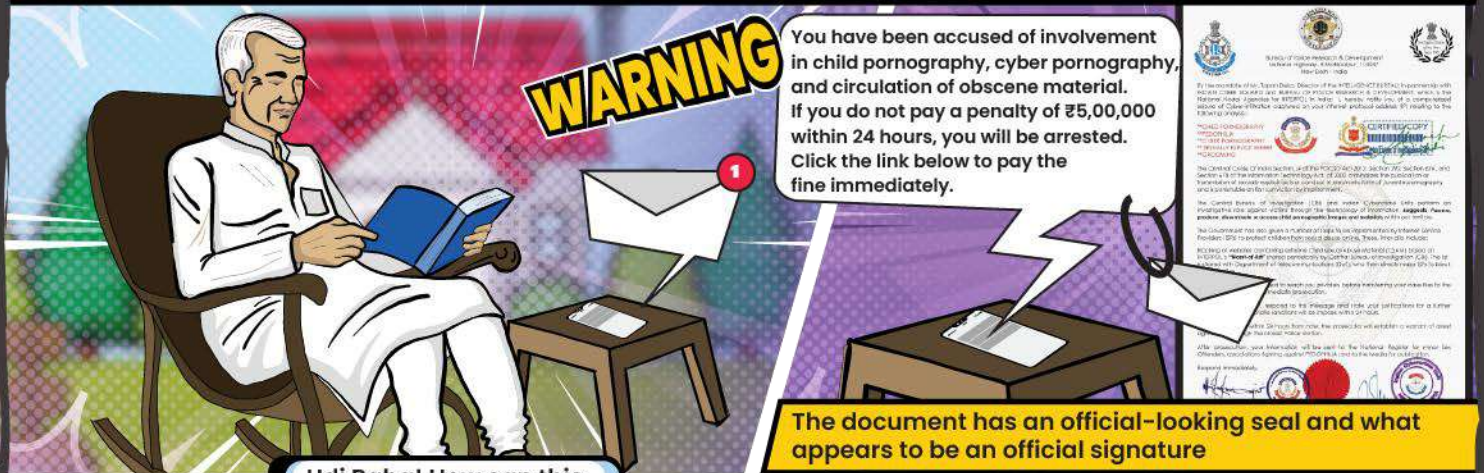

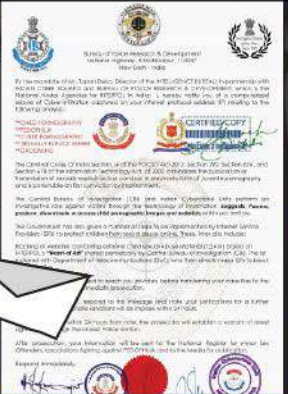
Ghosh Babu and the Digital Deception

Udi Baba! How can this be happening?



Hello, Ghosh Babu! How are you doing?

Just then, Hoshiyaar Singh, who happens to be strolling across the street at the time, notices Ghosh Babu's worried face and stops.

Hello, Hoshiyaar Ji.



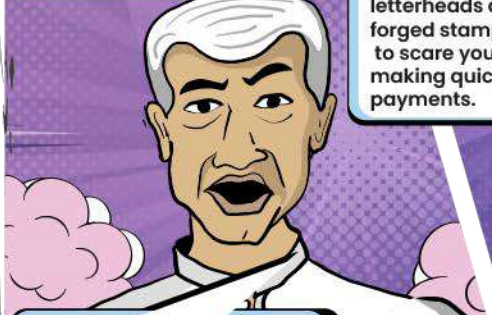
Ghosh Babu, this looks like a fake notice. No real government body – police, CBI, or any other – ever sends such messages or links via WhatsApp, email, or SMS.

I'm in a bit of trouble. Look at this WhatsApp message I've just got.

They're accusing me of watching child pornography. But I've done no such thing!

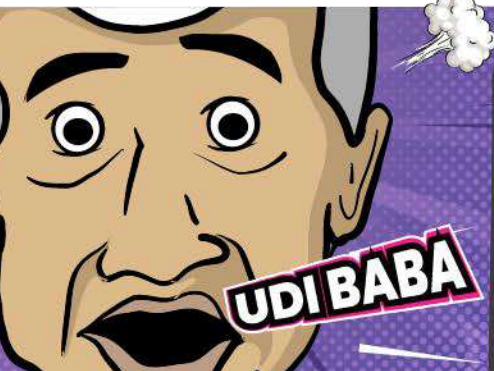
Ghosh Babu shows his phone to Hoshiyaar Singh.

Yes, but it isn't real. Scammers use fake letterheads and forged stamps to scare you into making quick payments.




Udi Baba! This actually happens??

So what do I do now?

First, stay calm. Call Bunty and confirm his whereabouts.

Scammers often pull personal info from social media. They use it to sound convincing.

Patel Bhai calls Bunty immediately.

STAY ALERT

Bunty, son... where are you right now?

Papa, I'm at college. Just finished with practicals. Heading to the café with friends.

Deepti versus the Online Trickster

Hoshiyaar Singh is at home, reading the newspaper and listening to old songs on the radio. Just then, his sister Deepti walks in, returning from college. She looks a little anxious. Hoshiyaar notices.



So Deepti, how was college today?

Hmm... you look a little worried. Everything alright?

Yeah... I'm okay. Just wanted to ask you something important.

It was okay, Bhaiya.



Of course, what is it?

₹30,000?! What do you need it for?

It's for the next semester's college fees.

Bhaiya... can I borrow ₹30,000?



But I just paid your fees last week. Why are they asking again?



Deepti freezes for a moment. A nervous sweat breaks out on her forehead. Hoshiyaar senses something is off.

Deepti, sit down. Tell me what's actually going on

Okay... so... a friend from London sent me a gift. But customs stopped it, and they want ₹30,000 to release it.

Hoshiyaar Singh looks a little worried after hearing this.

Wait, what friend? What gift?

He's a Facebook friend... Farzi Mehta. He lives in London and works for a big company.

We've been chatting for 1-2 months and last week, he has shipped me a gift parcel with an iPhone and a diamond necklace.

Bhaiya, he did send me a video of him packing it!


And today, Farzi had called and said that the parcel is stuck at customs. They're asking for ₹30,000.


Hoshiyaar listens quietly and calmly connects the dots.

Hoshiyaar picks up the newspaper and shows her an ad from I4C – about dating and impersonation scams. Deepthi reads it, her face drops.

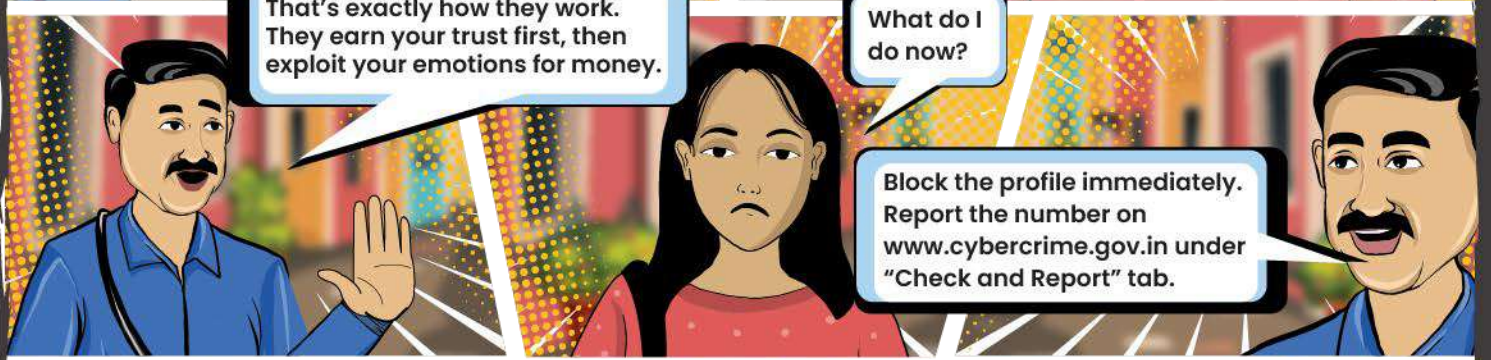


But Bhaiya... why me? We had such nice conversations...

That's exactly how they work. They earn your trust first, then exploit your emotions for money.

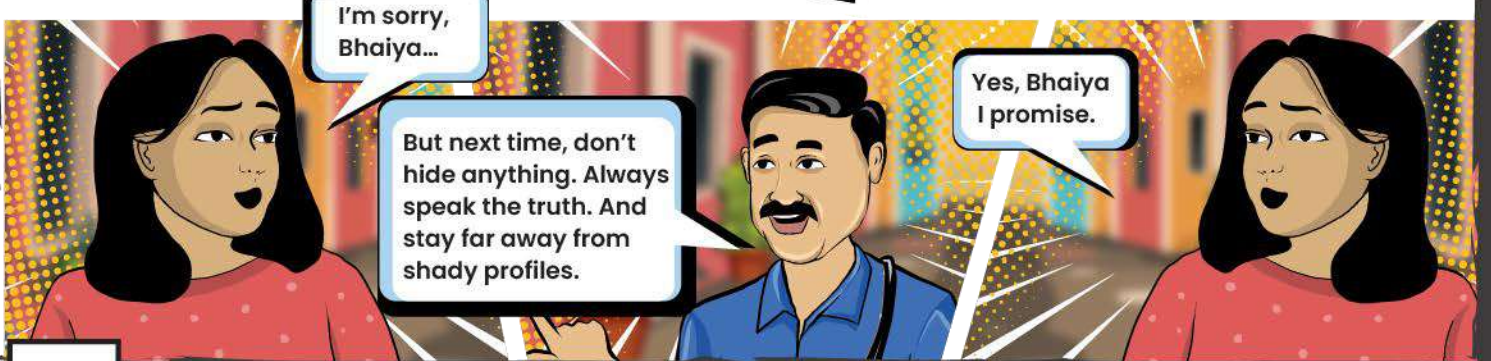
What do I do now?

Absolutely not! In such cases, go to www.cybercrime.gov.in and file a report under the "Check and Report" tab — without hesitation.



These scammers create fake profiles to trap innocent people. Their only goal is to scare you and extort money.

Buddhimaan Singh, an elderly man, is on his morning walk. Suddenly, he receives a message on his phone.



He looks at the message on the phone.

Hoshiyaar Singh begins to explain.

Bapu Ji, this is called an APK fraud. Scammers send you fake links to download apps, but in reality, it's a malware app that steals your bank details and OTPs from your phone.

NOTE

Malware App: A dangerous app disguised to look genuine, but once installed, it can steal your personal information, track your activity, or harm your device using spyware or viruses.

MALWARE APP/APK FRAUD

So if I had downloaded that app...I could've lost all the money in my bank account?

Exactly! These fraudsters trap people by offering tempting benefits.

Thank you, son. Good thing you warned me. I would've lost all my wisdom today!

- ★ Never click on links from unknown sources
- ★ Always check details only on the bank's official website
- ★ Never download APK files from unverified senders

They finish eating and walk toward home. On the way, they spot a poster stuck to a pole.



Nadaan Nautiyal lights up with excitement.

Oh come on! It's just a QR code scan — and I can get all this stuff at cheap prices!



Nadaan starts scanning the QR code. An attractive website opens, prompting him to download an app.



DOWNLOAD APP NOW



Hmm... it's asking me to download an app. Maybe I'll get even more discounts!

Never download apps from unknown websites, Nautiyal.

Why? What could go wrong?

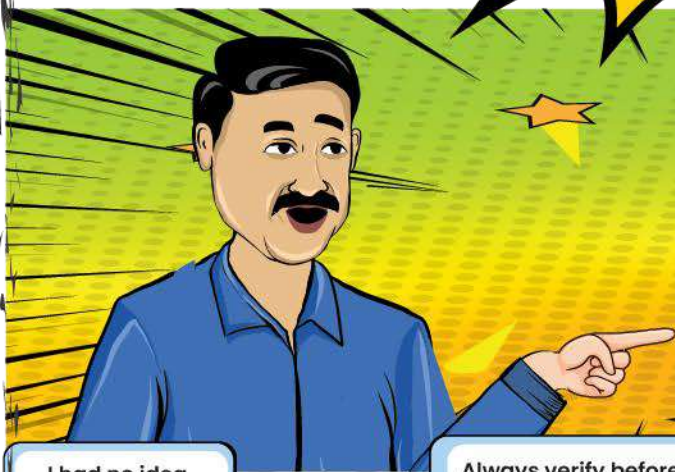


This could be a cyber scam

Huh? How?

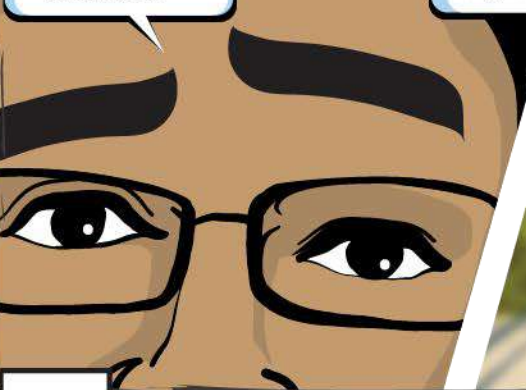


- ★ Scammers often use fake QR codes to trick people.
- ★ They create fake websites to steal your personal information.
- ★ They might grab your bank details and UPI PIN too.
- ★ Some QR Codes can even steal data directly from your phone.

I had no idea about this!

Always verify before scanning any random QR code.

You're right, Hoshiyaar. I need to be more careful.

Hoshiyaar Singh's wife, Jagrukta Devi, is extremely fond of online shopping. Every day, she browses different websites looking for the latest sales. One day, while scrolling through Facebook, she finds a shopping ad.



Just then, Hoshiyaar Singh returns home from office. He sees his wife glued to her phone.

Jagrukta Devi doesn't respond. Hoshiyaar notices she's lost in her phone and speaks a little louder.



She shows him the website on her phone.





Not yet... But I was thinking of buying a new fridge.

Why? What are you trying to say?

The one we have gotten old. What do you think?

My dear, your name is Jagrukta. Your name means awareness. How can you say things like this?



Off? Like what?

Doesn't anything feel off to you?

Have you ever seen such expensive items being sold this cheap?



But... it's a stock clearance sale, right? That's why the prices are so low.

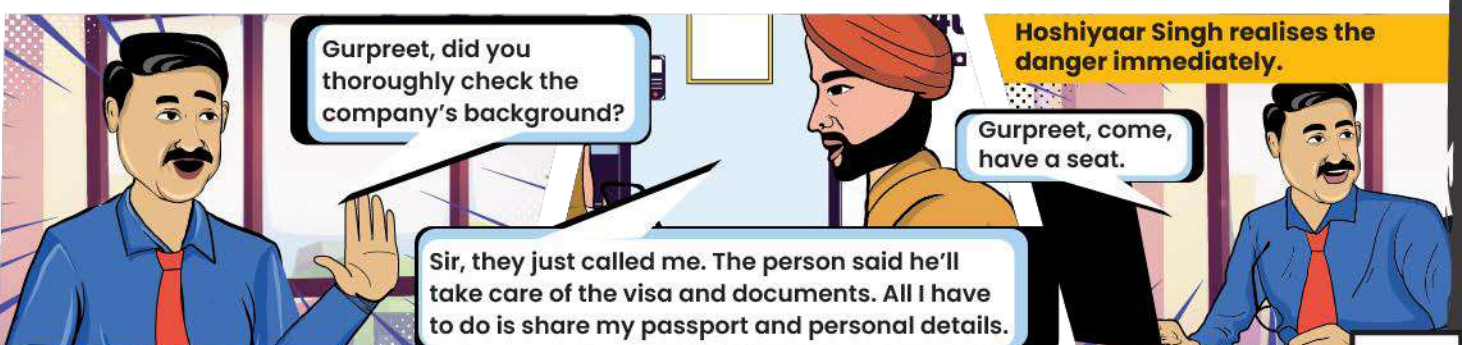


Gurpreet and the Overseas Job Trap

...and once people start investing bigger amounts, they tweak the app's programming to make you lose the game and take all your money.

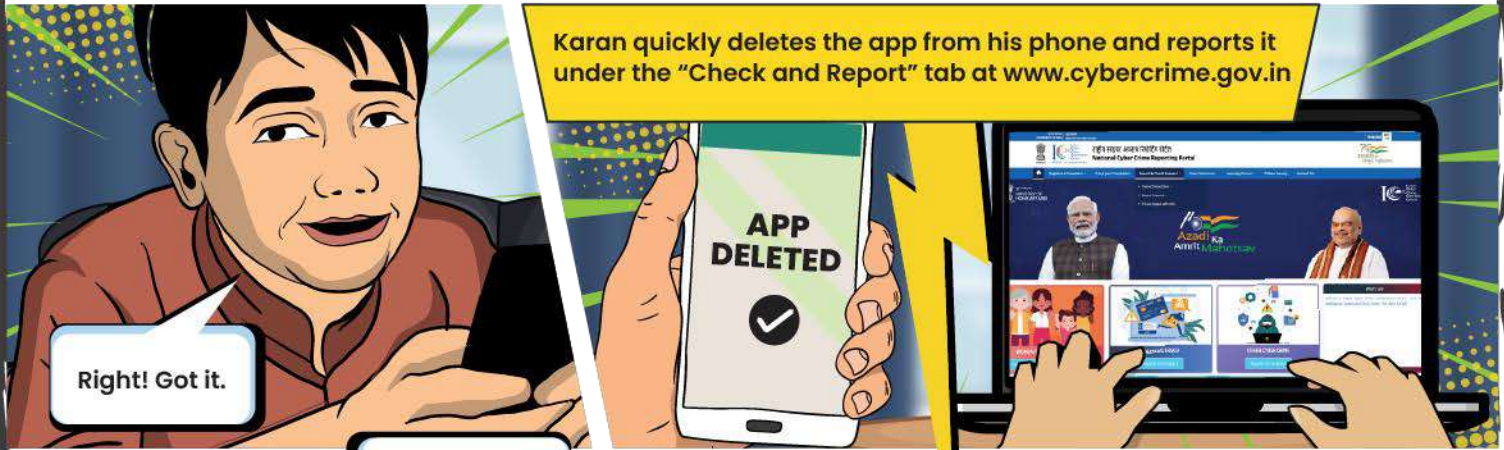


Karan is stunned.
